James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.' When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. ### **Harvest Dedication Crumblefest – next Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> October**

This year we are re-introducing Harvest Festival in connection with our school. This is something to rejoice the heart. The children will be coming down during the week for their church service and we will add our gifts to theirs at the altar at Mass next Sunday.

We will be asking for donations for Christians Against Poverty (CAP), a charity that works with people experiencing financial difficulties and struggling with debt. We will also be asking for your support for CAP by bringing donations of goods for them to put together into hampers – a gift to make someone smile and feel loved - as well as to stock up the store cupboard at the Guildford CAP centre, which is used for the immediate needs of families and individuals.

CAP would particularly appreciate tea, coffee, hot chocolate, baked beans, pasta sauces, special biscuits, tuna, hot dogs, tinned fruit, rice pudding, tinned custard, cooking oil, loo rolls, toothpaste, shower gel, toothbrushes and soap.

What we are not yet able to do is to have the usual meal and feast following the Sunday service to mark Dedication. Covid is still around and we must continue to be vigilant. However, we can still cautiously and with care for

each other, celebrate the many blessings of the Harvest and at the same time give thanks for those who built in wood, stone and glass, our beautiful church which we have inherited. So this year, we will have a Crumblefest – it does not require us to sit down too close together, we can still rejoice the Harvest and give thanks for the deposit of faith we inherit in this place. Next year, we can, we pray, do both Dedication and Harvest but for this year, let us proceed with care for one another.
