Confession or Reconciliation of the Penitent

I wanted to write to remind us all that the Sacrament of Confession continues to be available for those who might seek it. Confession, or to give it its full name, *The Reconciliation of the Penitent* is an important part of our tradition. This sacramental encounter is an opportunity to call to mind all that weighs us down and be reassured of the forgiveness of God. A few of us do make use of this ministry with me and some with a Spiritual Director. There is no confessional box (any more!), but there is an opportunity to reflect in advance of the conversation with me anything which might be causing worry, and then in the Confession itself, there is an opportunity to pray together and ask for God's relief and blessing. There is an information leaflet at the back of the church if this might be of interest to you and you can chat with me, too, of course.

Lent Lunchtimes

This Lent we begin our journey of faith with Mass at I Iam. This will be followed by a musical reflection offered in church – more detail below. Having fed ourselves spiritually and musically, we will then fill our tummies at lunch and, so sated, have an opportunity to reflect on the Stations of the Cross as our Lenten discipline. This will run from Friday 24^{th} February to Friday 31^{st} March. *Fr Neil*
