# **Fire Safety**

It is important to remind ourselves from time to time of what to do in the case of an emergency, such as a fire.

In the event of a fire being discovered, the priest, a churchwarden or sidesperson would blow a whistle, or make a clear verbal announcement, and then be responsible for calling the emergency services.

The congregation would leave through the nearest fire exit (north porch, the hall via the sacristy, narthex) and make their way to the car park opposite the church (next to the Town Bridge). We would expect people to assist those less mobile. Junior Church leaders would be responsible for exiting with the children, meeting parents in the car park.

The priest, churchwardens or sidespeople would also be aware of anyone not in church, for example in the Parish Centre.



# **The Living Organ Project**

As you will no doubt be aware, the PCC have endorsed a vision to rescue our Fr Willis organ. Over the years a great deal of money has been spent on the instrument and we are now at a stage in its life where we have to make a decision as to its survival. We have two options.

We can either replace the current organ with an electronic instrument or we can restore the current instrument.

After careful consideration, the PCC have suggested we opt for Plan 2. The understanding is that no money for this



- (i) **commissioned a report** to discover the extent of the work required for restoration. It was written by an internationally renowned Organ expert, the former Rector Chori of Southwell. If you are interested in reading this report, please do speak with Rick, our DoM.;
- (ii) begun to have **costings** the work of this restoration;
- (iii) begun to determine **how we might raise the money** for this restoration.

I am indebted to Phil (Deputy Warden) for his work as Convenor of this group.

So what?

# The Rector now needs your thoughts.

I would like you to write and let me know whether you think we are on the right tracks. Do you think we (the PCC and I) are right to work via the group to restore the organ? If you do, then I need your ideas HOW we are to do this.

Do remember, that this is not a fund raising exercise for the parish - no money from PCC nor DGT will fund this restoration. But we would all need to be involved and support it. So I would welcome your views, but more importantly, your vision - who might help us? How can we achieve raising what will be in the region of £250,000 - £300,000. The costing reports will confirm the exact figures, but with some degree of flexibility for a future fund, we are likely to be looking in this region. We can match fund and crowd fund, but I want to know what you think about if and how we can do this. Responses please by this Sunday.
