After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying 'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.' Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Our Good Cause for October is SoBS (Survivors of Bereavement by Suicide)



The Guildford SoBS group has been based here at St Nicolas' since 2015 and is a lifeline for people who have been bereaved by suicide. There are over 5,000 deaths by suicide in England every year. In Surrey, 92 people die by suicide every year and research shows that each death affects around 130 people. Those very close to their lost loved one are at 60% higher risk of taking their own life.

The group meets here monthly. It is a safe and confidential space offering peer support. The group is run by volunteers and costs are covered by fundraising. The national SoBS charity <u>www.uksobs.org</u> also runs a helpline 0300 1115065
