The ministers go in silence to the main entrance, one of them carrying the unlit Easter Candle.

All the lights in the church are switched off.

The priest and people stand at the entrance of the church

Christ yesterday and today,

All

the beginning and the end,

Alpha and Omega,

All to him be glory and power, through every age and for ever. Amen.

This is the day when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life. Throughout the world Christians celebrate the awesome power of God. As we hear his word and proclaim all that God has done, we can be confident that we shall share his victory over death and live with him for ever.

A minister lights the Easter Candle from the Holy Fire and the priest says

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

The people enter the church and the priest, following, carrying the Candle raises it sings

The light of Christ.

A joyful fanfare may be played, bells rung, cymbals clashed, noise made, lights switched on and the people's candles extinguished.

The Homily

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once

for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.







As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of Our Lady, Nicolas, George,

Benedict and all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.
