Dear friends in Christ, this is the night in which our Lord Jesus Christ passed over from death to life. The Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which through word and sacrament we share in his victory over death.

As we await the risen Christ, let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, recalling how he saved his people in ages past and in the fullness of time sent his Son to be our Redeemer; and let us pray that through this Easter celebration God may bring to perfection in each of us the saving work he has begun.

## Renewal of Baptismal Vows

*Priest* As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, we remember that through the paschal mystery we have died and been buried with him in baptism. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

*All* I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

*All* I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

*All* I repent of them.

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

*All* I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

*All* I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

*All* I come to Christ.

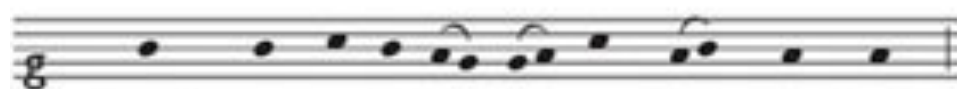

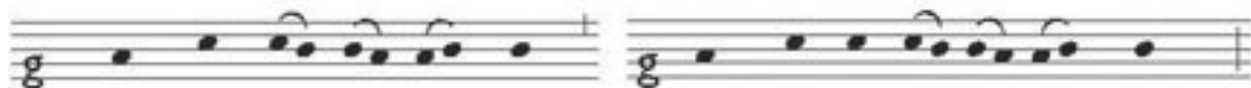

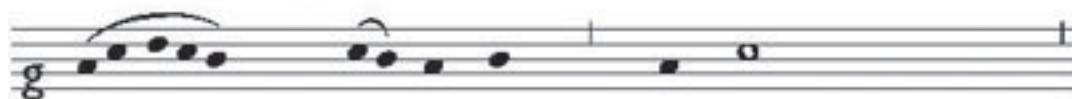
E-vil and ha-tred are put to flight and sin is washed a-way,

in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father,  
for ever and ever.
